<p><b>Luke 7:11-17</b></p>	<p><sup>11</sup>Soon afterward he journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. <sup>12</sup>As he drew near to the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. A large crowd from the city was with her. <sup>13</sup>When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her, “Do not weep.” <sup>14</sup>He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said, “Young man, I tell you, arise!” <sup>15</sup>The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. <sup>16</sup>Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, exclaiming, “A great prophet has arisen in our midst,” and “God has visited his people.” <sup>17</sup>This report about him spread through the whole of Judea and in all the surrounding region.</p>
<p><b>Mark 7:31-37</b></p>	<p><sup>31</sup>Again he left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. <sup>32</sup>And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. <sup>33</sup>He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man’s ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; <sup>34</sup>then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, “Ephphatha!” (that is, “Be opened!”) <sup>35</sup>And [immediately] the man’s ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. <sup>36</sup>He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. <sup>37</sup>They were exceedingly astonished and they said, “He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and [the] mute speak.”</p>
<p><b>Luke 17:11-19</b></p>	<p><sup>11</sup>As he continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup>As he was entering a village, ten lepers met [him]. They stood at a distance from him <sup>13</sup>and raised their voice, saying, “Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!” <sup>14</sup>And when he saw them, he said, “Go show yourselves to the priests.” As they were going they were cleansed. <sup>15</sup>And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; <sup>16</sup>and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan. <sup>17</sup>Jesus said in reply, “Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? <sup>18</sup>Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?” <sup>19</sup>Then he said to him, “Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.”</p>
