Directions: Copy and cut out at least one set. For advanced students, you may also wish to cut out additional sets to give a set to each pair. Then follow the directions in the session plan.

Where those who die in God's grace and friendship live with Him forever.	Where souls suffer in order to be purified.
Where souls who die in God's grace are purified before they enter Heaven.	Those who died with unconfessed mortal sin are separated from God forever.
