Pope St. John I

Pope St. John was the fifty-third pope. While he was pope, King Theodoric ruled over Italy. King Theodoric was an Arian, which meant that he did not believe the truths of the Catholic Faith. His rival was Emperor Justin, who was a faithful Catholic and the ruler of the great Byzantine Empire.

The Emperor Justin passed a law that took away the churches and positions of the Arian bishops. This made King Theodoric furious. He threatened the lives of the Catholics in his kingdom if the emperor did not change his law. Because of the king's violent threats, Pope John I agreed to Theodoric's order to travel to Constantinople (the capital of the Byzantine Empire) to try to change Emperor Justin's mind. Later, the emperor held a magnificent ceremony where the pope re-crowned him as emperor. This showed Emperor Justin's alliance with the Roman Catholic Church.

Instead of dressing himself in his best robes, King Theodoric dressed the pope in chains. Instead of throwing a joyous celebration, the king threw the pope into prison. While in prison, Pope John I was mistreated, and he soon died as a holy martyr.
